AS WE HEAD INTO SPRING...

I wanted to take a moment to update the citizens of Richfield on some upcoming and continuing projects happening in our city.

First and foremost: Yes, the pool project is still moving forward, even if it is slow going. Pursuing grant funding often takes time, and that is the phase of this project that we are currently in.

In November 2023, city officials went before the Community Impact Board (CIB) to request funding for our pool project. Due to a lack of oil and gas productions, the CIB is saving funding for more critical infrastructure at this time, however, we were asked to come back in the future. In the meantime, we are currently looking into other funding sources and pursuing other grants.

The city has recently completed a geo tech study, ensuring that we are able to go forward with our plan of building a new pool to the south of the existing pool. Upon construction of the new pool, the old structure will be demolished to make way for a new parking lot. We have also been working alongside the Lion's Club to make sure the Lion's Park is more accessible. We are working on adding walking paths, and developing new pavilions and a future playground.

The city is currently accepting pledges for the new pool through September 30, 2024. We are also taking donations for the pool through December 31, 2024.

Donation forms are available on the Richfield City website, along with recognition options. All funds from donations will be held in a special account specifically for the new pool. In the event that we are unable to proceed with construction, all donations will be returned to their donors.

In other city news, construction will soon begin on the pickleball courts, pavilions, and restrooms at the Nielson Park on the east side of town. We expect these to be operational by the end of May 2024. Additionally, the bike path continuation project will be starting soon, and infrastructure replacements and updates will be taking place throughout the summer.

I'd like to take this opportunity to wish Tyson Hansen the best of luck as he pursues new ventures. We have appreciated him as a valued city employee, and we are excited about the addition of Rob Jenson as the city's new Finance Director.

As always, remember to be kind and look out for each other. Take care of your neighbors, especially those who are elderly or who live alone. I'm grateful to live in this beautiful community and to be surrounded by wonderful people.
